CoderDojo Arrives in Liverpool

A global community that enables young people to discover the magic behind technology and learn computer coding has arrived in Liverpool. CoderDojo, a volunteer-led, free programming club for young people aged 7 to 17, operates in hundreds of destinations across the world has now launched a new digital media club here at The Studio.

The dojos held at The Studio will allow young people to learn how to develop computer code, websites, apps, programs and games, and support their creative and leadership skills. They will run once a month until June, from 9.30am – 11.30am. Our first coding session was a huge success with over 70 young people attending to get hands on with the magic of code.

Jade Parkinson-Hill, Director of Enterprise at The Studio, said: "We want to provide young people from across our city with an invitation to join a rapidly expanding global community, allowing them to access the skills of tomorrow."

"CoderDojo allows young people, and the adults that accompany them, to discover the changing nature of the digital industry in a fun, safe and innovative environment."

Made In Liverpool Retro Gaming Mezzanine



The Studio has taken a step back in time with a new, interactive exhibition which allows our students to discover how gaming has evolved from its humble origins to today's sophisticated titles.

The exhibition consists of three rooms that act as 'walk-in time capsules' and a home for the consoles of the past. Consoles featured in the exhibition range from the Commodore 64 to a ZX Spectrum, and from a Nintendo Entertainment System (NES) to more contemporary consoles such as the Dreamcast and Playstation 1.



The retro games installation works in conjunction with our 'Made in Liverpool' exhibition to showcase gaming titles that have been developed in Liverpool, and many of our partners and supporters have helped us fill the exhibition space with memorabilia. Liverpool based game artist Bob Wakelin provided a series of signed screen prints, and Lucid Games Ltd donated signed copies of games the team had previously worked on at Bizarre Creations.

Students will be invited to explore different areas of video game history during lunch-time and their breaks from classes to expand their understanding of the gaming industry.

The Studio Presents: Richard Stallman

A world-famous computer programmer, famed for his development of free software, has visited The Studio to deliver an inspiring talk to students.

Dr Richard Stallman, best known as the creator of the GNU/Linux operating system, hosted a seminar on coding and ethical practice at an event co-organised by staff and students.

On the evening of 9th December, our Year 11 student Adam introduced Dr Stallman to an audience filled with University professors, software developers and students. The content of the talk covered the creation of the GNU/Linux operating system and the importance of the Free Software Movement.

Shaun McInerney, Principal of The Studio, said:

"We actively encourage our students to think independently and to engage with issues that impact on their lives. Studio students identified Richard Stallman as a member of the digital community whose work had made an impression on the computing industry as we know it. We were proud to invite him to Liverpool to meet with key figures from across the city and of course, our staff and students.

"Listening to Richard offer his perspective on the digital world provided our students with a greater understanding of free software and enabled them learn through participation and engagement."



Exhibition Open Call

A group of our Year 12 students submitted their artwork as part of a competition held by local screen printing collective The Critter Shed.

Entrants were asked to create an A5 design interpreting the theme 'Creatures of the Night'. The Critter Shed judges were impressed by the work of our Sixth Form students and eventually managed to decide on the top three submissions.

The posters were judged on their response to the brief, technical execution and creativity. Third place was awarded to Sophie W, Jack K finished second and Ashleigh M was awarded first place for her creative piece of artwork that really grabbed the judges attention.



Students Build Community App

Four students from The Studio have spent the past year mapping the history of Liverpool's major faith communities to celebrate the launch of Liverpool's Footsteps of Faith: a cutting-edge Smartphone App designed by the Liverpool Community Spirit (LCS) Youth Council.

Following the launch of the app, the Youth Council will be working with local groups and schools through assemblies and workshops to promote the positive impact that faith communities have had on Liverpool over the years and the wider message that stronger communities are built from people understanding and respecting each other.



Studio Digital – Mentor Programme

In January we launched our new mentor programme for Studio Students. Each team is mentored by an industry professional to support their chosen pathway.

This year students have chosen from four pathways:

Game – Create a 2D Game

Internet of Things – Create Enchanted School Items

Film – Create a short movie about an aspect of the Studio

Entrepreneurship – Create an app, website, or monetised blog



We have launched the new pathways to support our students' career ambitions and to widen their horizons. As part of this process we have recruited over 40 mentors from gaming, film and digital companies to mentor our students over the next 12 weeks. These companies include Sony, Red Ninja, Lucid Games, Ripstone Publishing, Mocha Film, Milky Tea Studios, LJMU, Edge Hill University and also our newest partner Shop Direct, who run digital department stores including Very.co.uk and Littlewoods.com.

Most mentors are either senior level executives or Managing Directors of their own businesses, and our students have already made a great impression after just the first session.

Kate Rylance, Senior User Experience Researcher at Shop Direct met her team for the first time last week, and was extremely impressed. She said:

"Our User Experience Team really enjoyed the first mentoring session at The Studio and we were blown away by the students' confidence and the solid concept ideas that they were able to work with."

Students will meet their mentors every three weeks until the showcase on 1st April. All parents are invited to join at our showcase – 2-5pm, to celebrate the work completed throughout the Studio Digital Programme.
